## 58<sup>th</sup> Annual Meeting

### Schedule, travel, housing, parking, and more

**Registration:** The early registration fee is \$40.00 (students \$10.00) until January 1, 2018; thereafter, including at the meeting, registration costs \$60.00 (students \$20.00).

**Schedule:** The 58<sup>th</sup> Annual Meeting will be on Friday and Saturday, January 5 and 6, 2018, in Room 160, Kroeber Hall. Registration at the meeting will begin at 8:30 am on both mornings. Pre-registrants may pick up programs and nametags at that time. The program will begin at 9:15 am. All posters will be displayed during both days of the meeting. Friday evening is unscheduled; on Saturday there is a public evening lecture, followed by the President's reception. A preliminary program and abstracts will be posted on the IAS website in mid-November. Final versions will be posted closer to the meeting date.

**Housing:** The Institute does not arrange group hotel rates or reservations, except for a block of affordable rooms for students, to be announced separately. Attendees have recommended, in no particular order,

- The Durant Hotel <http://www.hoteldurant.com> , 2600 Durant Ave., Berkeley, CA 94704, (800) 738-7477 or (510) 845-8981. The traditional haunt, with Henry's watering hole at the lobby level. \$209- \$226 / night.
- The Bancroft Hotel <http://www.bancroftotel.com> , 2680 Bancroft Way, Berkeley, CA, 94704, (510) 549-1000. Former College Women's Club and Phi Mu Sorority, National Register landmark Arts and Crafts building across the street from campus, a short walk from Wurster Hall. \$135- \$179 / night.
- Berkeley City Club <http://berkeleycityclub.com/hotel/> , 2315 Durant Avenue, Berkeley, CA 94704, (510) 848-7800, Fax: (510) 848-5900 (on Durant a block below Telegraph). Amazing Julia Morgan "castle" with spectacular indoor pool under broad pointed arches. Close to Wurster Hall. \$219 / night.
- The Faculty Club (formerly Berkeley Men's Faculty Club) <http://www.berkeleyfacultyclub.com> , on campus, a block from Wurster Hall, (510) 540-5678. Classic natural wood paneled Maybeck Craftsman building. Neither club membership nor UC affiliation is required. \$98- \$300 / night.
- The Shattuck Plaza Hotel <http://www.hotelshattuckplaza.com> , 2086 Allston Way, Berkeley, CA 94704, (866) 466-9199 or (510) 845-7300. Recently renovated 1910 hotel, Berkeley's first and oldest. Close to BART, several blocks to Wurster Hall. \$199- \$229 / night.
- Downtown Berkeley Inn <http://www.downtownberkeleyinn.com> , 2001 Bancroft Way, Berkeley, CA 94704, (510) 843-4043 Fax: (510) 843-4046 (on Bancroft and Milvia, one block below Shattuck). Contemporary building, parking included. Easy uphill walk or bus to Wurster Hall. \$119- \$129 / night.

Prices are regular single-occupancy rates as of late 2016; better deals may be available, and most hotels allow multiple occupancy for a similar price. *Add 13% city tax to quoted rates above* except for the Faculty Club. Many local, reasonably priced rooms are available through Airbnb, at [www.airbnb.com](http://www.airbnb.com) .

**Transportation:** The two nearest airports are San Francisco (SFO) and Oakland (OAK). If you can handle your luggage, consider taking Bay Area Rapid Transit (BART, <http://www.bart.gov/guide/airport>) to the Downtown Berkeley station from either airport. BART takes about an hour from either airport. It costs \$9.55 from SFO, and \$8.50 from OAK. From the Downtown Berkeley station, it is a 0.9 mile walk (about ten blocks) to the centrally located Hotel Durant or the Bancroft Hotel, gently uphill. If you can catch a taxi from the station (you may have to call), it should cost \$8 to \$16. A shared airport shuttle directly to your Berkeley hotel involves less walking but takes longer. A shuttle such as <http://www.bayporter.com/> or <http://www.supershuttle.com> costs \$35 to \$40 plus a 15% tip from SFO, or around \$30 plus tip from OAK. A cab from SFO to your hotel takes from 40 minutes to over an hour and costs \$80 to \$100, depending on traffic, including a 15% tip; from OAK it should take 30 to 45 minutes and cost about \$50 to \$75. Rideshare services such as Uber are a bit cheaper. Return travel is similar.

**Parking:** Parking near the central campus may be scarce on Friday. On Saturday, many central University parking lots probably will be available to the public. Parking information is available at: <http://pt.berkeley.edu/park/visitor> , <http://www.ci.berkeley.ca.us/ContentDisplay.aspx?id=8260> , and <http://www.instituteofandeanstudies.org/locations.html> . The public parking lots closest to Wurster Hall are privately owned and fill up early in the day. They are:

- The Bancroft Hotel Parking Lot, 2680 Bancroft Way, just west of the Bancroft hotel
- Douglas Parking, 2304 Bowditch, just off Bancroft Way
- Bancroft Center Parking, 2558 Bancroft Way
- Telegraph Channing Garage, 2450 Durant Avenue, ½ block west of Telegraph Avenue

Daily rates at these lots range from \$15 to \$24. Rates are subject to change. Watch for signboard notices of temporary lot restrictions for special events. Fines can be high. Allow plenty of time to find parking.

**Alternatives to parking:** Consider coming to campus by public transportation. See <http://511.org> to plan trips on any public transportation; BART <http://www.bart.gov> (Bay Area Rapid Transit), and AC Transit buses <http://www.actransit.org> . Taxis, Uber, and similar services are also good options.

**Museum:** The Phoebe Apperson Hearst Museum of Anthropology, <http://hearstmuseum.berkeley.edu>, located in Kroeber Hall, University of California, Berkeley, and renowned for its Andean archaeological collections among many other important holdings, has reopened after major renovations. Researchers may be able to access portions of the collections for study by advance arrangement. Details will be available on the museum and Institute websites.
